Stage Director

The Director's job is to provide a framework of planning, organization, interpretation and guidance. He/she is a schedule maker, a creative thinker, an interpreter of text - a guide who knows which direction to take. The Director has a vision which is realized in a sense of purpose and structure.

The Director is responsible for the entire stage production. It represents the considered directoral choice. Though part of a collaborative team of production, technical and acting personnel who give input, help modify, even transform the initial concept, everything on stage has the Director's stamp of approval.

- Creates an overall vision for the Production including ideas for costumes, set, lighting, sound, etc.
- Work with Musical Director and Producer to arrange audition times
- Be present for auditions with Musical Director, Artistic Director and Producer. (Choreographer as well if dance call)
- Inform Producer regarding who is cast or not cast
- Work with Musical Director, Stage Manager and Producer to arrange rehearsal schedule
- Work with Producer & SM regarding crew. (Producer has final say, but you may give suggestions)
- Be present for all rehearsals
- Work with Stage Manager for staging notes and directions
- Work with props to ensure all props are appropriate
- Work with lighting designer before tech week regarding any special effects.
- Work with sound designer before tech week regarding any sound effects.
- Work with Set Designer ASAP to ensure there is enough time for the set to be built and painted.
- Work with Producer for any problems or issues arise If needed Artistic Director is your contact with the board if Producer is unavailable.

"In rehearsal the Director is both sounding board and a creative organizer of creative guidance and ideas. The mystery of being a good Director is the rapport between actor and Director; knowing when to help or to leave free, when to take control, when to let go."
