

Choreographer

The Choreographer is responsible for creating dance and movement routines for the performance.

Before creating a new routine, choreographers will meet with the director to discuss their vision of the production to complement the story.

After the routine is created, the choreographer teaches the steps to the performers at rehearsals. After showing the dancers the steps, the choreographer helps them perfect the movements, technique and timing. During rehearsals, a choreographer might make changes to the routine and then instruct the performers in performing the changed routine.

Other expectations of the Choreographer:

- Be present for auditions with the rest of the production team
- Be present for all scheduled dance rehearsals, performance runs and tech week. - Work with Director, Musical Director, Stage Manager and Producer to arrange rehearsal schedule
- Work with Musical Director to see if there are any difference between cast recordings and musical arrangements.
- Work with the Stage Manager and Musical Director to schedule rehearsal pianist for dance rehearsals (if needed).
- Select a dance captain from the cast to assist the Choreographer.
